She was the President of the Youth and Young Adult Choir for several years, and a member of the Missionary Society and the Mothers Board.

Dorothy was a loving mother, grandmother and great-grandmother. She

nourished her children in the fear of the Lord and made sure they were raised in the church in the word of God.

Dorothy was married to L. B. Harris. To this union they had one child, Corey Bernard Harris, who died at birth. Her husband preceded her in death in 1992. Her oldest child, Vickie Boswell Jordan, also preceded her in death in 1992.
