He was employed in the hospitality industry at the Marriott Corporation for more than 20 years, where he was the first African American to be recognized as a top sales producer.

He enjoyed life, traveling, family and friends. He was an astute observer of politics on the local, state and national levels. He actively campaigned for President Clinton and President Obama. He was known as a passionate advocate for human rights, equality and social justice.

He was known as a generous, caring, compassionate, and loving brother, uncle, and friend to many in his life. He was an avid traveler and his travels took him all over the world. His lived in St. Thomas and traveled to Spain, Egypt, Peru, Asia, and various countries in Africa.

He had two older brothers that preceded him in death: Samuel Leonard on April 19, 2007, and James Wesley on January 17, 2005.

Issac is survived by his sisters Hettie Gibson (Leonardo), Judy Bond, Tina Davis and Mary Ligon; his brother Frazier Searcy Jr (Jerri) and his uncle Winford Dickerson (Lillian) and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, family and friends.
