Laudell Glenn, affectionately known as Buddy, was born on March 28, 1931, in Madison County, Tennessee, to the late Willie and Viola Perry Glenn.

He was the younger of two siblings born to this union. He often mentioned growing up and being raised by his Uncle Rennie (Lorenzo Perry), who made a great impact on his life, secondary to him losing his mother at the age of six or seven years old.

Mr. Buddy was a master upholsterer known for his work covering automobile seats, floor boards, furniture, and church pews in Jackson and the surrounding areas for more than 40 years. He also worked at Baker Brothers Upholstery, Rockwell (present-day Porter Cable), and American Olean Tile. In his early years, he served in the Korean War.

A mild-mannered man, he had the heart of a true giver. He was a believer in Jesus Christ, who believed in standing on the principles of God's Word, no matter what. He was a servant who honored God and served faithfully at Bread of Life Church until his health failed.
