Mr. Manuel L. Williamson Jr., was born one of 14 siblings to the late Manuel Lee and Josephine Coe Williamson in Gibson County, Tn.

Dad was born in the era where our schools functioned in the Church Houses. He was awarded the Tennessee Public School Certificate for graduating 8th grade at Williams Chapel School. He made a career with Joseph E. Seagrams & Sons as a foreman cutting the wood and assembling huge barrels for the company product to be stored in until retirement.

Our dad was a hard worker and the sole provider in the home. He always had a car. He loved to fish, hunt, and work vegetable gardens until his health began to fail.

Loving the Lord was not in question. It was a priority in our house. Over the span of his life, dad was a Deacon, Sunday School Teacher, Sunday School Superintendent, a loyal member of the Sr. Choir and Male Chorus, and you could find him every morning (early) with a cup of coffee, his Bible, a pen, and pad studying the Holy Scriptures.

Age and health soon forced him and our mother to leave Antioch M.B. Church in Gadsden, TN. They became members of New St. Luke M.B. Church here in Jackson, TN.

He was married to Juanita Cox Williamson until her death for fifty-six years.

He is survived by four daughters, Brenda Broyles, Priscilla (Gaunzi) Bradley, Anita (Donnie) King, Shyvonne (Andre) Cole, and one son Charles (Cathey) Williamson. He leaves twelve grandchildren: Elder Juan Williamson (Thelmisha), First Lady LaFayna Flagg (Bishop Fredrick Flagg), Antonio Williamson, Gary Bradley, Demond Bradley (LaWanda), Tristian Bradley, Aaren Muex (Earnest), Jeremy King (Vrajhi), Cameron Cole, Kylan Cole, & Caleb Cole. 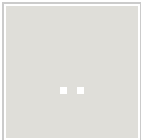
