Solonia Beatrice Fitzpatrick was born on March 20, 1932 as the only child to John C. Holt and Betty Fitzpatrick in Pulaski, TN. Solonia, also known affectionately as “Weed” by family and friends because of her slender build, was raised with her sibling Marcus Fitzpatrick. She departed to her Heavenly home on Nov. 19, 2025.

Solonia and her brother was mainly raised by her loving grandmother Martha Maxwell Fitzpatrick. Solonia was raised on a farm and has always loved many different animals since she was a child. Church was important to the family and Solonia was baptized at a young age. She attended and graduated from Bridge Forth High School there in Pulaski where she was an avid 4-H Club member.
